## Twelfth Grade Supply List 2018-19

### **In order to secure a successful start to the year, each student should have:**

- A backpack that will fit in a locker (backpacks are not allowed in the classroom – backpacks with wheels and side-packs tend not to fit in lockers)
- A TI 84 calculator for math classes
- 4 to 5 packs of notebook paper (more may be needed by mid-year)
- A one-inch notebook binder is suggested for each core class or students may choose to carry one large binder with classes separated inside. Math teachers usually prefer a separate binder for math class. NO spiral notebooks for math class. Other notebooks and/or folders may be necessary at instructors' request.
- A set of five or eight notebook dividers is needed for each binder
- At least one set of 8-10 markers and one set of 12 colored pencils
- An ample supply of pencils and pens (blue or black) along with a personal pencil sharpener or mechanical pencils
- A translation dictionary for foreign language class (only if scheduled for foreign language)
- A pack of graph paper
- A flash/jump drive that is PC and Macintosh compatible for saving assignments
- Index Cards 3 by 5 and/or 4 by 6 for various assignments / classes

### **Each student should bring (and give to the Language Arts teacher for sharing):**

- 3 boxes of tissues/Kleenex or 2 boxes of tissues and one roll of paper towels

### **Teachers always appreciate:**

Teachers often use personal money to purchase additional supplies for their classrooms. Check with a teacher to see how you can donate to your student's classroom. Donations can earn volunteer credit if first approved by the parent volunteer coordinator.

- Extra dry erase markers, dry erase board cleaner, or dry erase markers in various colors (or chalk, in limited amounts, for those with chalkboards)
- Extra packs of copy paper
- Extra boxes of tissue / Kleenex
- Paper Towels
- Computer ink cartridges (check with teacher for type)
- Electric pencil sharpeners
- Other specific needs for different subjects (check with teacher)

### **Students will be given:**

- An agenda mate (This is incredibly important for writing down assignments, due dates, and passes for hall access. If students lose their agenda mate, they must purchase a replacement – there is not an endless supply of these, so students should endeavor to hold on to their original agenda.)

## Senior Summer Reading

Seniors are required to read two books during the summer as follows:

- 1) *The Iliad* (Penguin Classics translated by Robert Fagle)
- 2) An *optional book* of the student's choosing

- Textbooks are not provided to the students. These textbooks will need to be purchased through the Chattanooga State Bookstore.
- The students will need to have the required textbooks for the fall semester on the first day of class.
